The details:

- Power Grid & Electric Distribution 101: Learn about work plans; capital budgeting and planning; reliability projects and challenges; SCADA, automation, metering and other technology; transmission dependency; etc
- Future Challenges (power supply; transmission; regulatory; state and federal energy policy; workforce; etc
