Rate increase planned for late summer

s I write this (mid-March) it looks like our rate increase later this summer will be less than 10% total, or around \$2.4 million in additional revenue. This is a preliminary estimate. (This would be similar to our last rate increase. That one, 13 years ago in 2010, was an 8% increase for an additional \$2 million in revenue.)

Each rate class (residential, seasonal, small commercial, large commercial, etc.) will see an increase. But they will

be of varying degrees. Our goal is to design rates that are close to what it actually costs us to make service available. This helps reduce the subsidies between rate groups.

Why \$2.4 million (preliminary estimate)? How did we come up with that number?

In simple terms, we're running low on money. Annually we do detailed financial forecasts, and our forecasting shows us running short in the near future. We haven't had a rate increase in 13 years, and the expenses and inflation have caught up with our number one goal of providing reliable electricity. If we want to continue to provide reliable electricity, we have to continue to invest in our electric system. We spend \$3-4 million every year on electric

system maintenance and improvements, not including labor, taxes, interest and other growing expenses. If we don't do the rate increase, we would need to stop electric reliability maintenance and upgrades. Which means your power would go out more often, and for longer periods.

While most other utilities have had big increases, we're unique, being able to say it's been 13 years since our last increase; which means our upcoming increase averages out to less than 1 percent per year.

Please take advantage of our savings and energy efficiency programs, outlined in this month's *Ohio Cooperative Living* magazine and on our website. We have rebates to help you buy more energy efficient appliances, water heaters, heat pumps, and geothermal. We have billing discounts if you use our AutoPay or our paperless methods. We provide free energy audits. Our online program, called SmartHub, has your monthly, daily, and hourly electric use data and you can even get high use alerts. Our online energy calculators help you identify what uses the most power.

Please plan to attend our June 3 annual meeting, where the rate increase will be discussed in greater detail. Keep an eye on the magazine, this newsletter, and our other communications for updates.

USING A PORTABLE GENERATOR SAFELY



- 1. Always use a generator at least 20 feet away from your home.
- 2. Never operate one inside a home, on a porch or near windows and doors.
- 3. The 20-foot rule also applies to other locations, such as a shed, cabin, camper or trailer.
- 4. When shopping for a generator, look for one that produces reduced emissions.
- 5. Also look for one that shuts off automatically when high levels of CO are present.
- Keep your generator well-maintained and follow all manufacturer's instructions.
- Ensure CO detectors are installed on every level of your home and near or in bedrooms.
- 8. Test CO alarms monthly; also track their age. They need to be replaced every seven years.


