

Lighting the way for 90 years

idwest Electric's story began in 1936, when rural families across west central Ohio were still living without the convenience of electricity that city residents already enjoyed. A small group of local leaders gathered at the Barr Hotel in Lima to form what would eventually become Midwest Electric, sparking a movement that quickly spread across farms and rural communities. They held town meetings, visited neighbors, and shared the life-changing potential of electric service. Soon, farmers eagerly signed up, maps were drawn, and construction began with the help of low-interest federal loans.



By 1938, the young cooperative was already serving 440 homes and farms with 167 miles of line, operated by just two employees and contracted linemen. As the co-op grew, so did

its identity, evolving from its original Farm Bureau name to "Midwest Electric" by 1939. The office moved several times before settling at the current St. Marys location in the mid-1960s. Through it all, the mission stayed steady: bring electricity to the people who needed it most.

Nearly 90 years later, much has changed, but the cooperative principles remain the foundation. What started as lineworkers using bare hands and uninsulated tools has transformed into a modern, safety-driven operation.

Today, members benefit from technologies like Distribution Automation, digital mapping through GIS, Advanced Metering Infrastructure, and SmartHub tools that offer real-time account management and billing transparency.

Even as electricity prices rose from about 5 cents per kWh in the 1930s to around 14 cents today, these increases remain modest compared to the cost of everyday goods. Electricity continues to be one of the best values for essential services. And through partnerships with Buckeye Power and Ohio's Electric Cooperatives, Midwest Electric has maintained rate stability by owning and operating its generating resources—avoiding the volatility seen across much of the energy market.

Beyond keeping the lights on, the co-op has strengthened the region through decades of community support. Scholarship programs, the Community Connection Fund, economic development loans, and more than \$45 million returned to members in patronage cash back highlight just how deeply the co-op invests in the people it serves.

As Midwest Electric approaches its 90th anniversary in 2026, it proudly reflects on the vision and hard work of its founders and early employees. Their dedication helped build a cooperative rooted in reliability, service, and community—and that legacy continues today. With gratitude for its members and a commitment to innovation, Midwest Electric looks ahead to the next 90 years of powering and uplifting the communities it was built to serve.

- The reimbursement will be in the form of an electric bill credit. You must send us your receipt or proof of purchase to receive the reimbursement.

Instructions:

Contact your local SWCD. Typically, they require an order form that can be mailed or downloaded from their websites, and they require payment when your order is placed. Deadlines are usually in early March.
