Your electric bill is getting a revamp!

We are breaking out charges and adding new features to make reading your bill easier


Usage history:

A new tool you can use to compare your current electric usage to last month's and the prior year's. It also shows the high and low temperatures so you can see

how the weather impacts your bill. You can get more detailed electric use history, including daily and hourly use history, by logging into your SmartHub account or mobile app.

Energy Charge (old bill format):

In our old electric bill, the Energy Charge includes the kWh energy charge, the Power Cost Adjustment, and the Service Charge all bundled together.



Energy Charge:

Shows the number of kilowatt-hours (kWh) you used during this billing period (around 30 days), times our electric rate. You can lower this charge through energy efficiency measures, including our energy audits.

Power Cost Adjustment:

This is not directly a Midwest Electric charge, but reflects changes in the cost we have to pay for the generation and transmission of electricity.

Service Charge: Flat monthly fee shared equally by all members to pay fixed costs of our electric distribution system, like poles, wires, substations, tree trimming, interest, depreciation, and upgrades for service reliability.

Community Connection

"RoundUp": Participating members round up their bill to the next dollar, with the spare change going to our Community Connection Fund. 88% of members participate. Donations are dispersed by a separate board of members to local charitable causes. No administrative fees are taken. Call us to sign up.

Ohio kWh Tax: Levied by the state and averaging \$0.004 per kWh. It's based on the amount of electricity you use. We must send this on to Columbus.

MARCH BILL INCLUDES YOUR 2019 PATRONAGE

How much of Midwest Electric's margins from last year will YOU receive?

Look for that amount on your enclosed electric bill.

Your electric bill this month lists the amount allocated to your patronage capital account based on last year's margins. The information will appear near the upper right corner of the bill, under the Message box.

As a Midwest Electric member, you have a share in the earnings of your not-for-profit electric cooperative. Your cooperative's electric rates are set to bring in enough money to pay operating costs, make payments on any loans and provide an emergency reserve. Revenues in excess of the cost of doing business are returned to members like you as "patronage capital."

Patronage capital payments typically occur in December, if the cooperative's financial standing is sufficient. Last December, the

cooperative returned more than \$1.4 million in patronage capital to members based on margins and kWh sales from 2003.

Our margins, or money left after all expenses have been paid, are allocated to each member based on the total amount each member paid for electricity for the year.

Patronage capital represents tangible proof of your equity ownership in your cooperative. A portion of your electric payments is used by the cooperative as working capital and invested in the cooperative's electric distribution system. After a period of time, the investment is returned to you.

The amount allocated to you from 2019 is payable at a future date.
