# The California wa<mark>ke up call</mark>

You may have heard about the rolling blackouts in California in mid-August. The blackouts occurred because there wasn't enough electricity being generated to meet the demand. In other words, there was a shortage of electricity. California spent the past 15 to 20 years reducing coal and natural gas-based generation, becoming increasingly reliant on renewables. Californians also pay 60% more than the national average for electricity.

Let's learn from California's mistakes. Let's continue to develop and explore renewable technology. But we can't deny the scientific fact that renewables cannot supply power 24/7/365 in all weather conditions. Therefore, fossil fuels and nuclear power absolutely must remain a significant part of America's power mix.

Midwest Electric and Buckeye Power (the power supplier for Ohio's electric cooperatives) support an all-of-the-above power generation strategy that includes coal, natural gas, nuclear, hydro, wind, biogas, and solar. All of those, except nuclear, are in our portfolio. We help individual members who install their own renewable power, and we buy their excess production. ## Ward off energy waste

Did you know that electric devices can continue to use energy even when they are not in use? When equipment is plugged in and left idle, power is drawn from the outlets. This leads to increasing energy waste and spiked utility bills. This energy waste is also referred to as a "phantom" or "vampire" energy.

Stand-by power is used when an electronic device is consuming energy aside from performing its main function. Common phantom power culprits include computers, battery chargers, and treadmills. Stand-by power accounts for between 3-10% of energy costs.

#### Use these tips to avoid stand-by power loss:

- When possible, unplug all electronics not in use, especially those not often used.
- Consider powering down devices rather than leaving them on standby mode for extended periods.
- Power strips can aid efficiency as they can turn off all devices that are plugged in with flip of a switch.
- Smart power strips use advanced technology to turn off the power from idle electronics automatically.
- When shopping for new electronics, invest in ENERGY-STAR-certified products, which have a lower standby rate of energy consumption.
- By using an electronic timer, you can reduce the standby load on items used only in select periods of the day, such as coffee pots.
